**LAST YEAR:** Last year the teams played three times. They split the series in the regular season and then St. Ben's claimed a 77-73 victory in Memorial Auditorium in the semifinals of the MIAC tournament. Before that game, each team had held serve at home with the Blazers winning 75-63 in St. Joseph and the Cobbers gaining an 83-75 win in Moorhead. The playoff loss snapped a 15-game winning streak for the Cobbers, and it was the first loss at home for Concordia during the entire year.

**SERIES:** St. Ben's leads 29-20

**SERIES HISTORY:** Concordia dominated the early part of the series, winning 11 of the first 14 games. The Blazers then went on a seven-game winning streak from 1990-93. The teams then went 4-4 in the next eight games before St. Ben's won 13 of the next 15...current Cobber head coach Jessica Rahman is 3-4 in her career vs. Blazer coach Mike Durbin...the Cobbers are 3-7 against the Blazers in the last 10 games played in Memorial Auditorium...in the past 12 games between the teams, the winning team has scored at least 73 points in the game.

### VOTE FOR JESSICA!

Concordia head coach Jessica Rahman is one of 25 Division III players on a ballot to select an all-time Division III team. Five players and one coach will be honored as part of the 25th season of NCAA women's basketball. Fans can go to the Cobber women's basketball website to find a link to the NCAA voting page. Hopefully Jessica will be recognized for her outstanding contribution to the game and will be one of the five players honored. The honorees will be selected by the fans, so it is up to everyone to get out and "Vote for Jessica." Fans can vote once per e-mail address, and even St. Ben's fans are encouraged to vote for the MIAC all-time scoring leader.

She is nominated as a player for her unbelievable run during the late 1980's. She was a four-time All-American and helped the Cobbers win the national championship in the 1987-88 season. She is still the all-time scoring leader in the MIAC, having scored 1,491 points in her career. She was also honored with the NCAA Division III Player of the Year in 1988 as well as the Honda Award as the NCAA Division III Female Athlete of the Year.

### TAKING DEAD AIM

One of the biggest turnarounds for the Cobbers since they last faced the Blazers is their new-found offensive prowess. Concordia is averaging 71.4 points in their last eight games and is 6-1 in conference play during that time. The reason for the change might be as simple as an increase in their ability to shoot the basketball. The Cobbers are currently leading the league in free throw percentage (75.3%) in conference games. They are also second in 3-point percentage (37.6%) and fourth in overall field goal percentage (39.0%). That is a long way from the first three games of the MIAC when they were averaging 51 points per game and shooting 67.4% from the free throw line and 28.6% from 3-point range.

### MAGNIFICENT MELANIE

Another reason for Concordia's turnaround from the start of the year and their continued presence at the top of the MIAC is the play of sophomore post player Melanie Hageman. She is currently sixth in the MIAC in scoring (16.3 ppg), fourth in rebounding (7.4 rpg), second in field goal percentage (55.3%) and third in free throw percentage (81.7%). That last stat is particularly relevant since she is one of only three players in the league who has made at least 60 trips to the free throw line.

### SCOUTING THE BLAZERS

St. Ben's enters today's game having lost their last outing to Gustavus 71-70 at home. All three of the Blazers' losses this season have been by a single point. The loss in their last game doesn't bode well for Concordia since St. Ben's hasn't lost back-to-back games since the end of conference play in the 2003-04 season. The Blazers can score from the inside or outside. They are currently ranked 19<sup>th</sup> in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage (37.4) and 22<sup>nd</sup> in scoring margin (+ 17.3). Their margin of victory in MIAC games is even more gaudy as they are beating opponents by an average of 21.25 points.

### FINALLY

The Cobber Gameday staff is happy to announce that this will hopefully be the final appearance in Memorial Auditorium for Blazer senior Anna Heikenen. Heikenen has been one of the premiere players in the MIAC for the past three seasons and is on pace for an MVP season. She currently leads the MIAC in scoring (19.2ppg). The GD staff wishes Anna all the best after graduation – thanks for all the memories (and the grey hair)!

## Concordia Women's Basketball Coach

### Jessica Rahman

Jessica Rahman is entering her third season as head women's basketball coach in 2005-06. In her first two seasons, she has guided Concordia to a 40-12 mark and consecutive appearances in the MIAC postseason tournament. In her inaugural season in 2003-04 she brought the Cobbers all the way to the championship game of the MIAC playoffs.



Rahman, formerly Jessica Beachy, was a four-time All-American standout at Concordia and helped the Cobbers win the national championship in the 1987-88 season. She is the school's all-time leading scorer and was inducted into the Concordia Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

After graduating magna cum laude from Concordia in 1988, Rahman earned an M.A. degree in education from North Dakota State University in 1998. She was the assistant women's basketball coach at Concordia from 1991-93. She left Concordia and became the Christian Education Director at Trinity Lutheran Church in Jamestown, N.Dak. While working as education director she was the assistant women's coach at Jamestown College from 1995-96. Following her stint at Jamestown she was the head girl's basketball coach at Dickinson (N.D.) High School in 1998 and 1999. She then moved to St. Cloud to take her current position.

Jessica Rahman, originally from Staples, Minn., came to Concordia in 1984 after a highly successful high school career at Staples-Motley. In her four years at Concordia, she helped the Cobbers win 96 of the 118 games in which she played.

Rahman ended her Concordia career with 2,101 points - 17.8 points per game. She still holds the MIAC record for career points with 1,491 - 17.8 points per game.

## Last Game Recap

**ST. PAUL, Minn.** -- The Concordia/Hamline game came down to the old adage, "it's not how you start the game, it's how you finish." The Cobbers used the strength of an 11-4 run in the final 3:00 of the game to post a 63-57 win over the Pipers.

Hamline, who battled all the way to the end but was undone by the final 3:00 of play, falls to 4-6 in the conference and evens their overall record at 7-7.

Melanie Hageman had another stellar night for the Cobbers. The sophomore post player had a game-high 22 points and a game-high 12 rebounds. It marks the third time this season that she has finished with more than 20 points and the third time that she has posted a double-double. In all three games that she has scored 20-plus points, she has also grabbed 10 or more rebounds. Hageman has now scored in double figures in the past five games.

No other Concordia player scored more than eight points in the game. The Cobber bench continued to be one of the best in the league. Head Coach Jessica Rahman was played 11 different players and was able to rotate line-ups throughout the game in order to keep the Pipers off balance. Concordia's bench outscored the Hamline reserves 20-17, upping the record to 8-0 when the Cobber reserves outscore their counterparts.

Kelly Lines was 4-of-6 from 3-point range and finished with a team-high 17 points. Her ability to hit the timely outside jumper kept Hamline close throughout. Her long-range shot with 4:14 remaining even gave the Pipers a brief 3-point lead at 52-49.

After that point it was all Concordia as three straight free throws tied the game at 52-52, and then an Annie Keeley put the Cobbers ahead 55-52 with 2:31 left in the game.

For the game, Concordia shot 37.9% (22-of-58) from the floor and went 5-of-16 (31.3%) from 3-point range. Hamline shot 35.2% (19-of-54) from the floor and 37.5% (6-of-16) from behind the arc. Both teams were solid from the free throw line. The Cobbers were 14-of-18 (77.8%) from the line and the Pipers went 12-of-14 (85.7%).

The biggest difference in the box score came in the turnover department. Concordia's defense forced Hamline into 22 turnovers, while the Cobbers only committed 14 miscues.

## St. Ben's 2005-06 Season Outlook

The 2005-2006 blazer basketball team would not mind picking up right where they left off in 2004-2005. CSB finished the season 24-5 with a regular season MIAC record of 16-4, which placed them third heading into the MIAC playoffs. After beating Carleton 77-74 in the MIAC Championship game the Blazers kept charging into the NCAA Div. III Tournament. The Blazers made it to the Sweet Sixteen where they were defeated by George Fox (Ore.). Though CSB fell short at end their momentum was unquestionable.

With four returning starters and a talented supporting cast the Blazers' plans of getting off to a fast start this season look promising. CSB is ranked ninth in D3Hoops.com preseason poll and also made their way to a ranking of 14th on the USA Today ESPN Division III Top 25 Coaches' preseason poll.

"I'm thrilled that the team is in a great position early in the season," head coach Mike Durbin said. "We still have a lot to prove on the court, but I believe that our players will respond."

Anna Heikenen who was named to the D3Hoops.com All-American fourth team last season finds herself on the D3Hoops.com preseason All-American second team and the sole senior on the Blazers' roster. "Anna is one of the top players in the MIAC as well as Division III," Durbin said. After becoming the first Blazer to surpass 500 points, by scoring 514 points last season, she has already found her spot among CSB's all-time scoring leaders with 1,060 points in her career.

Joining Heikenen will be returning junior starters Darby Noreen, Jen Dalhed, and Katie Kempe. The trio combined for 225 assists, 90 steals, and 666 points last season.

"Our back court is solid," Durbin said, "Not only do our starters have experience but also the drive to make our team more effective at both ends of the court."

Other returners from last season who look to make an impact for Saint Ben's this season include juniors Ellie Boone and Jamie Goehner joined by sophomores Judy Falvey, Mackenzie O'Neil, and Jenna Tody.

Several incoming first-year athletes including Kari Schroeder, Nikki Carter, and Ariel Tauer plan on making immediate contributions to the team.

"One of the many strengths we will look to take advantage of this season is our depth," Durbin said.
