LAST TIME THEY MET: Concordia claimed the first meeting of the season 65-53. The story of the game was in the play of the guards. The Cobbers' backcourt outscored their counterparts 40-7. Jessica Heintz had a game-high 20 points, Annie Keeley added 17 and Ashley King chipped in three. Concordia's quickness on the perimeter took advantage of the Knights' zone defense and the Cobbers were able to take their first lead of the game midway through the first half and never looked back.

SERIES: Concordia leads the series 38-10

SERIES HISTORY: Last year the two teams split the series by winning on the other team's home court. The win by the Cobbers in Northfield snapped a 10-game losing streak against the Knights. Before that 10-game stretch, Concordia had won 36 straight against Carleton...the Cobbers are 18-4 at home vs. the Knights in the series but haven't beaten Carleton in Memorial Auditorium since December 8, 1999...only three times in the last 20 meetings between the two teams has the game been decided by fewer than nine points. The closest game during the last 20 games was in 2003-04 when the Knights held on for a 67-63 victory in Moorhead.

NO POMP, LITTLE CIRCUMSTANCE

One of the least celebrated playoff-clinching events took place on Wednesday when Concordia officially clinched a spot in the MIAC playoffs. The deed was accomplished not because of the Cobbers' lopsided non-conference victory over Macalester, but due to the fact that St. Ben's beat St. Kate's later in the night. The Wildcats' loss puts their record at 6-9 and into a tie for seventh place. Since only six teams make the playoffs, it is mathematically impossible for Concordia to lose more than eight games in the conference season. The trip to the conference tournament is the fifth in the last six years for the Cobbers.

PLAYOFF CALENDAR WATCH

The MIAC women's basketball playoffs start the week of Feb. 20. The first round games will be held on Monday, Feb. 20 with the semifinals on Wednesday, Feb. 22, and the championship game on Saturday, Feb. 25. The top four teams in the league will host at least one game so chances are that the Cobbers will host a playoff game. In the first round the #3 seed hosts the #6 seed and the #4 seed hosts the #5 seed. The two top seeds then host the semifinals.

2006 – THE YEAR OF THE COBBER

Since the turn of the calendar, the Cobbers have found their stride and are playing some of the best team basketball in years. Concordia is 10-1 since Jan. 1 and is currently on a seven-game winning streak. After today's game, they will host St. Kate's on Monday at 5:30pm.

THE UNSUNG HEROES

One of the biggest reasons for the Cobbers' success this season is because of their ability to play 10-12 players and not miss a beat. Cobber freshman guard Ashley King is one of those unknown players who comes in, gets the job done and helps Concordia rack up the wins. King's ability to break down the opposing team's defense with her speed has been a real factor when the Cobbers are facing an opponent that likes to pressure full court or has a very quick point guard (i.e. Gustavus). She is fifth on the team in average minutes played per game (23.7 min/game). Her real asset comes in taking care of the basketball where she has only turned the ball over 17 times in the team's 19 games while averaging 23.9.

SCOUTING THE KNIGHTS

Carleton comes into today's game having won two straight and seven of their past eight games. Their latest victory was probably one of the highlights of the season as they came back from a 35-21 halftime deficit to defeat Gustavus 57-53. The Knights held the Gusties to four field goals in the final 20 minutes and outscored Gustavus 36-18 in the second half. Carleton's strength is their size and ability to shoot consistently from the field. The Knights lead the MIAC in field goal percentage (44.3%) and also in opponent's field goal percentage. Carleton's opponents are hitting only 36.4% from the floor in MIAC games. They also lead the MIAC in defensive rebounds.

SHE'S VIGRIFFIC!

Carleton has been led in the past four years by Megan Vig. Vig is a three-time MIAC All-Conference performer and has been one of the top three players in the league for the past few years. She leads the Knights in scoring, averaging 15.6 points and 7.8 rebounds per game. She is fourth in the league in rebounding and sixth in scoring and is scattered among the top 15 in many other categories. Because of her work ethic and ability to go out and play the game night in and night out, she has always been one of the Gameday Staff's favorite opponents to watch. She will be missed in years to come and the entire Concordia basketball program will breathe a sigh of relief when she crosses the stage for graduation. However, she is still the GD Staff's second favorite Vig!!! (Her brother Paul is a former Cobber and we are still upset with him that he couldn't talk Megan into attending Concordia!!)

Concordia Women's Basketball Coach

Jessica Rahman

Jessica Rahman is entering her third season as head women's basketball coach in 2005-06. In her first two seasons, she has guided Concordia to a 40-12 mark and consecutive appearances in the MIAC postseason tournament. In her inaugural season in 2003-04 she brought the Cobbers all the way to the championship game of the MIAC playoffs.



Rahman, formerly Jessica Beachy, was a four-time All-American standout at Concordia and helped the Cobbers win the national championship in the 1987-88 season. She is the school's all-time leading scorer and was inducted into the Concordia Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

After graduating magna cum laude from Concordia in 1988, Rahman earned an M.A. degree in education from North Dakota State University in 1998. She was the assistant women's basketball coach at Concordia from 1991-93. She left Concordia and became the Christian Education Director at Trinity Lutheran Church in Jamestown, N.Dak. While working as education director she was the assistant women's coach at Jamestown College from 1995-96. Following her stint at Jamestown she was the head girl's basketball coach at Dickinson (N.D.) High School in 1998 and 1999. She then moved to St. Cloud to the job of head girl's coach at St. Cloud Tech.

Jessica Rahman, originally from Staples, Minn., came to Concordia in 1984 after a highly successful high school career at Staples-Motley. In her four years at Concordia, she helped the Cobbers win 96 of the 118 games in which she played.

Rahman ended her Concordia career with 2,101 points - 17.8 points per game. She still holds the MIAC record for career points with 1,491 - 17.8 points per game.

Last Game Recap

MOORHEAD, Minn. -- In the end, Concordia's depth and all-around scoring attack were too much for the individual effort of Macalester's **Elise Pagel**. The talented freshman scored a game-high 23 points but it wasn't enough to overcome a Cobber team that had 10 players score at least two points en route to a 70-43.

Melanie Hageman led the Cobbers in scoring for the fifth time in the past six games. She finished with 18 points and six rebounds. She has scored in double figures in the past ten games. Guards **Annie Keeley** and **Jessica Heintz** each had 11 points and both made three 3-point field goals. **Sarah Krabbenhoft** hauled down a team-high eight rebounds to go along with five points. Pagel, the future of the Macalester program, took 17 shots in the game which was almost half of the team's 35 total shots for the entire 40 minutes. She was 8-of-17 from the field and 7-of-8 from the free throw line. She also had six rebounds and two assists.

The Scots came out in the early part of the game and played with the intensity to keep the game close. Their 2-3 zone defense slowed the Cobber offense for the first part of the opening half. Concordia led by three points and was only able to score seven points in the first five minutes of the game. The Cobbers then settled into an offense that would exploit the zone and went on a 10-3 run to open the game up and put the momentum on the bench of the home team.

Concordia followed the 10-3 streak with a 10-2 run and the separation was complete with the Cobbers leading 27-9. The Scots were able to trade baskets with the Cobbers for the rest of the half and Concordia went into the lockerroom with a 41-22 lead at the break. Macalester made a run to start the second half, trimming the lead to 14 points by scoring the first five points of the second period.

The teams would go scoreless for almost the next two minutes before the Cobbers finally go on the board in the second half with a 3-point field goal from Keeley at the 17:43 mark.

From that point on Concordia would keep the deficit at 20-plus point for the remainder of the half as they waltzed to a 70-43 victory.

Concordia shot 40.6% (28-of-69) from the field and 36.0% (9-of-25) from behind the arc. Macalester did not make a 3-point field goal the entire night, going 0-of-3 from behind the arc. They shot 42.9% (15-of-35) from the field.

The Cobbers dominated the game from underneath. Concordia outscored the Scots 30-10 in points in the paint and had a 15-2 edge in second chance points.

Carleton Women's Basketball Coach:

Tammy Metcalf-Filzen

In eight seasons at the helm of Carleton's women's basketball program, Tammy Metcalf-Filzen has established herself and Carleton's program as one of the elite in all of NCAA Division III. She's been named the MIAC's Coach of the Year three times as well as the Russell Athletic/WBCA Region Coach of the Year three years. Under her watch the Knights have been consistently ranked in the nation's top 10 and have averaged more than 20 wins over the past five seasons.



Metcalf-Filzen has presided over one of the most remarkable turnarounds in all of NCAA Division III women's basketball. When she took over prior to the 1997-98 season, the Knights had a program winning percentage of .323. Since Metcalf-Filzen assumed the head coaching position, the program has winning percentage of .720 and posted four consecutive 20-win seasons from 2000-04. Metcalf-Filzen has led Carleton to a 44-11 record over the last two seasons, 69-14 over the last three, 93-20 over the last four and 115-25 over the last five seasons.

Carleton Last Game Recap

Northfield, Minn. - Megan Vig (Sr./Northfield, Minn.) scored 19 points and grabbed 13 points as Carleton College erased a 14-point halftime deficit by holding Gustavus Adolphus College to four second-half field goals in rallying past the Gusties, 57-53. The Knights (12-8, 10-5 MIAC) outscored the Gusties 36-18 in the second half, ended the game on a 10-3 spurt and limited the Gusties to 29 percent shooting for the game. The Gusties went without a field goal in the final 9 minutes, 21 seconds, and had only seven points during that stretch.

Jess Vadnais paced the Gusties (13-5, 11-4 MIAC) with 19 points and Bri Monahan added 13 points. The duo combined for 23 first-half points but were held to nine in the second half as Monahan was 1-for-10 in the second half while Vadnais did not have a field-goal attempt in the second half. Monahan, the MIAC's leading scorer, was 5-of-22 from the field. Anna Biewen (Fy./Edina, Minn.) added 11 points for Carleton and (Fy./Rockford, Minn.) tallied seven points and seven rebounds.

The first half was all Gusties, as the visitors drained eight 3-pointers and built the lead to as many as 16 behind Vadnais going 4-for-5 from deep. The Knights responded right out of the locker room, getting the deficit down to eight four minutes into the period. The Gusties bumped the lead to 10 points midway through the half, but Lincoln and Vig scored on consecutive baskets inside. The Knights took the lead for good with less than two minutes left on a Vig free throw, and the Knights made 8-of-10 free throws down the stretch to cap the comeback. Carleton outrebounded the Gusties, 43-36, and outscored Gustavus 26-10 on points in the paint. Gustavus forced 18 Carleton turnovers and held a 17-9 advantage in points off turnovers.
