LAST TIME THEY MET: Concordia used a 10-3 run at the start of the second half to turn a 3-point halftime lead into a comfortable 10-point margin on their way to beating St. Kate's 67-53 in St. Paul. Melanie Hageman finished with a game-high 25 points and hauled down 11 rebounds for Concordia. She was one of only two Concordia players to score in double figures. St. Kate's was led by Rachel Berglund who knocked down 17 points. The game was decided in the second half as the Concordia defense limited the Wildcats to 19.4% (7-of-36) shooting from the field. CSC finished the game by shooting 27.7% (18-of-65).

SERIES: Concordia leads the series 31-4

SERIES HISTORY: Concordia has won the last five games in the series. St. Kate's beat the Cobbers in the second game of the series in 2002-03 marking the first time they had beaten the Cobbers in 24 games. The Concordia string of 24 wins dated all the way back to the 1980-81 season. Ironically, in the loss in 2002-03, Cobber forward Jamie Visness missed a free throw in the first half, ending her NCAA record streak of 69 consecutive made free throws...St. Kate's won the first two games in the series.

BACK IN THE SADDLE

Concordia is back in action after only one days rest. The Cobbers will be hoping to wash out the sour taste of Saturday's loss to Carleton. The defeat dropped the Cobbers out of first place (only because St. Ben's has played one more game) and brought the Blazers and Gusties back into the championship race. If both Concordia and St. Ben's wins their remaining games, the two teams would share the MIAC title and depending on order of finish at the end of the regular season, one will be given the home court advantage for the conference tournament. The two-day turnaround marks only the third time all season that the Cobbers have had to play on a day of rest. Concordia is 2-0 in the first two games. They will play at Augsburg on Wednesday in the final "one day between games" break of the season. From the obscure stat-of-the-day file - under Jessica Rahman, the Cobbers are 10-2 in games that are played after only one day of rest.

THE DRIVE FOR 65

One of the biggest trends to come out of the three conference losses and the five overall losses seems to be the Cobber defense. When Concordia holds their opponent to under 65 points in a game, they are a perfect 13-0. When the Cobbers allow their opponent to score 65 or more points, they are 2-5. All three of their conference losses have come when their opponents have scored more than 65 points.

QUEENS OF THE GLASS

One of the only statistical categories that Concordia is at the top of in the MIAC is in rebounding. The Cobbers lead the league in defensive rebounding and rebounding margin. Concordia is limiting their opponents to only 31.8 rebounds per game in the team's 15 conference games and they are outrebounding their opponent by an average of 3.9 rebounds per game (more than one rebound more than the team that is currently in second place in the MIAC).

STATISTICAL ODDITY

Saturday's game against Carleton was one of the exceptions to the rule in rebounding for Concordia. In the Cobbers' four previous losses of the season, they had been outrebounded in every single game. Against the Knights, the Cobbers held a significant 36-20 margin.

AHA

A further look inside the numbers reveals that even though the Cobbers held a significant edge in rebounding, the real trend that was prevalent was their inability to hit the 3-point shot. Concordia shot just 21.4%, and made only three shots from behind the arc against the Knights. That was only the fifth time in league play that Concordia has shot under 30% from long range. In those five games, the Cobbers are 2-3.

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

If the season were to end before tonight's game, St. Kate's would be in the playoffs. That is a remarkable feat considering the fact that they have never been in postseason play in the history of the program. The Wildcats enter tonight's game 7-9 in the MIAC and ½ game ahead of St. Thomas and Hamline for the sixth, and final, spot in the playoffs. The good news is that they have swept Hamline in the season series so they hold the tie-breaker over the Pipers should they end up deadlocked. The bad news is that they have to play three of their final four games on the road. After tonight they will play at Carleton and then return home to play St. Olaf before finishing off the regular season at St. Thomas. The Gameday Staff hopes that Wildcats remain in the hunt until the final game and then have the opportunity to secure a spot in the playoffs and knock the Tommies out of the playoffs in the final game of the season! St. Kate's is led by the inside-outside tandem of Sarah Schneider and Rachel Berglund. Schneider leads the team with a 13.0 ppg average and Berglund is averaging 12.6 ppg. The pair has led the Wildcats in 14 of the team's 21 games, including the last three.

Concordia Women's Basketball Coach

Jessica Rahman

Jessica Rahman is entering her third season as head women's basketball coach in 2005-06. In her first two seasons, she has guided Concordia to a 40-12 mark and consecutive appearances in the MIAC postseason tournament. In her inaugural season in 2003-04 she brought the Cobbers all the way to the championship game of the MIAC playoffs.



Rahman, formerly Jessica Beachy, was a four-time All-American standout at Concordia and helped the Cobbers win the national championship in the 1987-88 season. She is the school's all-time leading scorer and was inducted into the Concordia Athletic Hall of Fame in 1998.

After graduating magna cum laude from Concordia in 1988, Rahman earned an M.A. degree in education from North Dakota State University in 1998. She was the assistant women's basketball coach at Concordia from 1991-93. She left Concordia and became the Christian Education Director at Trinity Lutheran Church in Jamestown, N.Dak. While working as education director she was the assistant women's coach at Jamestown College from 1995-96. Following her stint at Jamestown she was the head girl's basketball coach at Dickinson (N.D.) High School in 1998 and 1999. She then moved to St. Cloud to the job of head girl's coach at St. Cloud Tech.

Jessica Rahman, originally from Staples, Minn., came to Concordia in 1984 after a highly successful high school career at Staples-Motley. In her four years at Concordia, she helped the Cobbers win 96 of the 118 games in which she played.

Rahman ended her Concordia career with 2,101 points - 17.8 points per game. She still holds the MIAC record for career points with 1,491 - 17.8 points per game.

Last Game Recap

MOORHEAD, Minn. -- Concordia wasn't able to overcome a 38.0% field goal percentage, a 21.4% shooting percentage from 3-point range and 20 turnovers and lost to a hard-charging Carleton team 70-64.

Concordia was led by sophomore Melanie Hageman. Hageman led all players with 22 points. She also hauled down a game-high 14 rebounds. It is the fifth time this season she has posted a double-double and sixth time she has scored 20-plus points.

Jenna Freudenberg was the only other Cobber to score in double figures as she finished with 10 points.

Megan Vig was the high-scorer for the Knights with 19 points, but the difference-maker in the game was reserve forward Sarah Lincoln. Lincoln, who was averaging 7.0 points put up a 14 points and hauled down a team-high six rebounds.

The game on the court was decided in the second half. After the teams traded runs throughout the first 20 minutes and played a free-flowing, rhythmic first half. The second period was characterized by multiple stops and starts because of 30 fouls. In the first half the referees allowed the teams to play and there were only 10 free throws attempted. In the second half, the two teams combined to shoot 43 free throws.

For the first 20 minutes, the teams traded the lead seven times and with Carleton hitting the final shot of the period to grab a 27-26 lead at halftime. The second half looked to be a repeat of the first as Concordia caught the Knights after four minutes and briefly took the lead at 34-33. That is when Carleton seized control of the game. In the next two minutes, they outscored the Cobbers 8-0 and grabbed a 44-36 lead.

Concordia was able to cut the lead to four points at the midway point but every time they made a run, Carleton would respond. The margin was cut to three points with 1:45 remaining in the game and it looked as if the game would be decided in the final seconds. However, the Knights four straight points to take a 69-62 lead with only 30 seconds to go.

In the end, the margin was six points at 70-64. The Knights finished the game by shooting 49.0% (25-of-51) from the floor and 35.7% (5-of-14) from behind the arc.

The Cobbers held a decided 36-20 edge in rebounds but were outscored 24-14 in points from players coming off the bench. Lincoln's 14 points were a huge part of the Knight bench success.

St. Catherine Last Game Recap (courtesy of Augsburg SID)

ST. PAUL, Minn. - Rachel Berglund (So., Dawson, Minn./Dawson-Boyd HS) and Sarah Schneider (Jr., Shakopee, Minn.) scored 21 points apiece, as the College of St. Catherine led from start to finish in a 65-57 win over visiting Augsburg College in a Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference women's basketball game Saturday afternoon at the Butler Center.

St. Catherine (9-12 overall, 7-9 MIAC) scored the first seven points of the game and eventually built a 22-point first half lead, before Augsburg (5-15 overall, 3-13 MIAC) rallied to cut the lead to eight points in the second half.

Augsburg was paced by Katie LaGrave (So., Okinawa, Japan/Kadena HS), who claimed her first double-double of the season and third of her career with 16 points and a career-high 14 rebounds. Rosinta Stromquist (Sr., Brooklyn Park, Minn./Robbinsdale Cooper HS) scored 12 points with four blocked shots and four rebounds, and Alissa Blood (Jr., Mounds View, Minn./Irontdale HS) had 10 points.

Berglund hit four three-pointers, scoring 12 points, in the first half to lead the Wildcats to a 37-18 halftime advantage. Schneider had 11 points and six rebounds in the first half. But Augsburg cut the lead to single-digits in the second half, opening the stanza with a 15-5 run to trail just 42-33 with 16:51 left. LaGrave had seven points in the Auggie run. St. Catherine rallied to re-take a 15-point lead, but Augsburg again cut the lead to eight points, 55-47, with 8:19 left. However, the Auggies could not cut the lead under eight points the rest of the way.

Berglund added five steals and eight rebounds, in addition to her 21 points. Erin Petrich (Jr., White Bear Lake, Minn.) had eight points, six rebounds and three assists for the Wildcats. St. Catherine outrebounded Augsburg by a 49-39 margin. Augsburg had 23 turnovers, compared to 21 for St. Catherine.
