SERIES STARTED: 1979

LAST YEAR: Last year the two teams split the series with each team picking up the victory on the road. Hamline pulled off the huge upset in the first game as they downed Concordia 67-60 to earn their first win over the Cobbers in Moorhead. CC then avenged that loss by posting a 76-64 win in St. Paul later in the season. In the first game, the Cobbers shot 31.1% (19-of-61) from the field for the game and a scant 17.1% (5-of-29) from 3-point range.

Melanie Hageman led all players with 27 points. She went 8-of-9 from the floor and 11-of-15 from the free throw. Hageman also hauled in a team-high nine rebounds. Hageman was the only Concordia player to score more than eight points. The Pipers had four players in double figures for the game. **Rochelle Sather** was hot from the field the entire game. She went 7-of-9 from the floor and 3-of-4 from 3-point range to finish with 22 points. **Krystal Tschumperlin** added 15 points, while reserve guard **Grace Weinreich** had 11 points and **Shelby Hyllengren** came away with 10 points. The difference in the game was the outside shooting touch of the Pipers. While the Cobbers were unable to hit from behind the arc, Hamline shot 50.0% (8-of-16) from the 3-point range. On the trip south, CC led for all but 23 seconds and won by 12. Concordia led by eight at the break and then went on a 23-5 run in the first 10 minutes of the second half to put the game away. Concordia had five players with at least eight points in the game and was led by the 16 points of **Annie Keeley**. Unlike the first game, the Pipers were unable to connect on shots from outside the arc in their own gym. HU went 6-for-23 (26.1%) from 3-point range. All the statistical categories were almost even with the only difference coming from shooting percentage. The Cobbers shot 51.0% (26-for-51) from the field and 38.5% (5-for-13) from outside the arc. Besides the 26.1% from long range, the Pipers shot 36.5% (23-for-63) from the field. HU had only two players with more than eight points. Hyllengren had 14 points and six rebounds in the losing effort.

SERIES SYNOPSIS: Last year's win by Hamline snapped a six-game winning streak for the Cobbers. Prior to the win on Jan. 6, 2007, the last win for Hamline over CC was during the 2002-03 season. Before that loss to the Pipers, Concordia had won 34 straight...Hamline broke a streak of eight straight games against CC without scoring in the 70's in the 78-70 loss earlier this year...last year's 60-point offensive total in the loss was the least amount of points scored against the Pipers in the 51-game series history for Concordia.

Concordia is coming off a gut-wrenching 74-62 loss at St. Kate's on Monday. In that game, the lead changed hands 13 times before the Cobbers finally went ice cold from the floor and lost by 12. CC missed 12 of their final 13 shots in the game to give the Wildcats their first win over Concordia in the past ten attempts. Prior to that game, the Cobbers beat Macalester and St. Olaf on the road to get to within one game of first place in the MIAC standings. CC is now tied for third place with Gustavus – two games back of St. Ben's and St. Thomas.

1,500-POINT PLAYER

Melanie Hageman became the fifth player in program history to score 1,500 points in a career. Hageman had a team-high 17 points against St. Kate's on Monday and now has 1,513 points for her career. With her total against the Wildcats she moved into fourth place on the school's all-time scoring list. She passed **Nancy Halda** who scored 1,504 points from 1978-82. Next up for Hageman is **Michelle Thykeson** who had 1,697 points from 1987-91.

THE MAGIC OF 74

Concordia has five conference losses this season and all five have come when the Cobbers allow the opposing team to score at least 74 points. In their five MIAC defeats, CC is allowing 77.4 points. In their 11 MIAC wins, the Cobbers are giving up an average of 58.5 points per game. Last week they allowed 58 points to St. Olaf and 50 points against Macalester and won both games. On Monday they gave up 74 points vs. St. Kate's and lost. Concordia is currently seventh in the conference in points allowed in MIAC games. CC is giving up an average of 64.4 points in their 16 league games.

UP NEXT

Tonight's game is the second of a stretch where the Cobbers will play four games in seven days. After playing at St. Kate's on Monday and then hosting Hamline, Concordia will travel to Bethel on Saturday and then finish off the tough trek by playing at Gustavus on Monday.

Hamline has won two of their last three games and is 7-8 in the MIAC. They are currently holding onto the sixth, and final, spot for the postseason. The Pipers have a two-game lead over St. Kate's, Bethel and Macalester. Unfortunately the schedule makers were unkind to the Pipers as they will play four of the top teams in the league in their last seven games of the season. Mother Nature didn't help out HU's cause either as their game with St. Mary's on Monday was postponed until Feb. 11. The Pipers are now starting a stretch where they will play four games in the next seven days.

WE'LL BE BACK

The Hamline starting lineup includes four juniors and a freshman meaning that all five will be around for next year. If the Pipers remain healthy, they should have a legitimate chance to break into the top five in the league in 2008-09. That would be appropriate for the four juniors because as freshmen they finished fifth in 2005-06. That was the last time they made the MIAC playoff as well. The best MIAC finish in program history came back in 1985-86 when HU finished in third place.

MARY, MARY QUITE CONTRARY

Hamline is led in scoring by freshman Mary Wilkowski, The only non-junior starter is averaging 13.9 points per game and is currently 11th in the MIAC. She is also 10th in rebounding (6.5). Against CC in the last game she had 15 points and 10 rebounds.

Concordia vs. Hamline Game 1 Recap

Concordia 78 at Hamline 70 – Jan. 7, 2008

One streak was stopped, another was kept alive. The Cobbers held off a solid Hamline squad down the stretch to post a 78-70 victory in St. Paul on Monday. The win ups Concordia's win streak to five and puts an end to their road losing for the season. CC was 0-4 on the road in 2007-08. The victory pushes the Cobbers' overall record above the .500 level for the first time this year. CC is now 5-4 in all games and 4-2 in conference contests. The 4-2 mark jumps Concordia into a tie for third place in the league standings.

The Pipers drop out of a tie for third place and even their MIAC mark at 3-3. HU watches their four-game winning streak come to an end as they fall to 6-3 overall.

The first part of the opening period went to the Pipers as they built a 15-7 margin in the first five minutes of the game and then held onto the lead until all the way until the 5:44 mark. After taking the first five minutes to get rid of their bus legs, the Cobbers steadily chipped away at the Hamline lead and eventually took their first lead when Maggie Bauernfeind connected on a layup.

After that point, the teams traded spurts and the game was tied at 37-37 heading into the break.

The second half belonged to the relentless pressure of the Concordia defense. In the second 20 minutes, the Cobbers had eight steals, forced 11 turnovers and outscored Hamline 41-38. The Pipers took their only lead of the half at 40-39 at the 18:07 mark and then watched as CC went on a 7-0 run to take a 46-40 lead and grab control of the game.

2007-08 HAMLINE PREVIEW (Courtesy of the Hamline SID)

Not only has the roster size increased, but so has the talent pool for the Hamline University women's basketball program as the Pipers enter their fourth season under head coach Melissa Young-Kruse. After losing only two seniors from the 2006-07 campaign to graduation (forward Ashlee Senter and guard Megan Haugen), the strength of Young-Kruse's returners and recruits should help the Pipers improve upon a 13-12, 11-11 MIAC record from a year ago. Talented multi-sport (volleyball, basketball, track and field) student-athlete Shelby Hyllengren's (Sr., Cannon Falls, Minn.) strong presence off the boards returns following a junior season in which she finished fourth in the MIAC in rebounds (58 on offense, 118 defensively, 176 total for an average of 7.3 per game). She is re-joined by four strong junior players with a variety of talents from the 2006-07 season and a sophomore who showed off her skills in an impressive rookie campaign.

Young-Kruse will look to 5-11 Britta Schwartzhoff (Jr., Hayward, Wis.) to quarterback her offense. Schwartzhoff has great court awareness and plays with intelligence – always knowing when to push the ball and when to slow the play down. Her classmate Grace Weinreich's (Wahkon, Minn.) hustle on the court should help put the ball in Schwartzhoff's hands frequently, Weinreich's determination on defense led her to a team-leading 35 steals last season. Another junior guard, Krystal Tschumperlin (Eden Valley, Minn.), brings a balance of clean, classic outside shooting and tenacious defense to the floor – and the ability to shine during key moments in a game. Jessica Heinen (Spicer, Minn.), the fourth returning junior, played in a well-coached high school program where she learned the "ins and outs" of the game. She provides a calm presence on the court and can shoot from both the inside and the outside. Rochelle Sather (So., Andover, Minn.) returns for her sophomore year after an impressive collegiate debut. In just 20 games played, Sather finished fourth on the team in scoring, averaging 7.5 points per game. A guard/forward who doesn't back down and will take charge on defense (she totaled 12 blocks, 16 steals, and 76 rebounds that included 53 on defense), she looks to significantly increase her numbers in her second year with the program.

Young-Kruse has a populous class of talented first-years and an exciting transfer player looking to get playing time early. Sophomore Tiana Wilkinson (St. Louis Park, Minn.) comes to Hamline after a year at the University of Mary (N.D.). A graduate of Hopkins High School's basketball program, Wilkinson is a tough defender who can elevate for rebounds – and does the same on her jump shots and lay-ups. Bringing a strong presence to the middle that Hamline hasn't seen in Young-Kruse's tenure will be Mary Wilkowski (Fy., Savannah, Ga.). She has the ability to put together physical play in the paint with graceful moves that are rare to see from players in her position. Forwards Mikaela Fisher (Fy., North Liberty, Iowa) and Karleen Smurawa (Fy., Pulaski, Wis.) will help under the basket by adding athleticism. Fisher is a strong student of the game with impressive defensive skills, which will compliment Smurawa's silky-smooth play inside to add points to Hamline's score. Two new Piper guards join the team with an unusually strong knowledge of the game and an eagerness to learn, having grown up in coaches' families. Kristin Sczublewski (Fy., Pierz, Minn.) developed a strong knowledge of the game from a father who coaches basketball, while Jackie Kelly (Fy., Blaine, Minn.) has developed a passion for studying the intricacies of a sport from a mom who is a volleyball coach. Sczublewski is a feisty player who dishes out great passes on the floor, while Kelly's smart play and strong shooting will contribute from the outside.
