LAST YEAR: Last year Concordia swept the series with the Cardinals, winning 64-42 at home and then prevailing 70-64 in Winona in the final game of the regular season. In the opener in Moorhead, CC started on a 14-2 run, built the lead to 22 points at 49-27 just after the break and downshifted their way to the 22-point win. The Cobbers shot 39.7% (25-of-63) from the floor and 35.7% (5-of-14) from 3-point range. The Cobber defense turned up the pressure and keyed the victory. CC held SMU to only 29.5% (13-of-44) from the field and 20.0% (3-of-15) from behind the arc. Concordia also forced the Cardinals into committing 21 turnovers. CC turned those 21 miscues into an 18-2 advantage in points off of turnovers. **Annie Keeley** led all scorers with 14 points for Concordia. St. Mary's was led by **Nicholle Hanson** who came off the bench to score a team-high 12 points. The second game was a lot closer in the end, but for most of the contest, the Cobbers held a double-digit lead. CC led by 13 at halftime, pushed it to as many as 19 points in the second half, and then hung on to win by six. Concordia led wire-to-wire to post the series sweep over the Cardinals. Keeley was one of three Concordia players to finish in double figures. Keeley had 12 points and was outdone by backcourt mate **Jenna Freudenberg** who knocked down a pair of 3-point field goals and finished with 14 points. She also had six assists and did not commit a single turnover. **Melanie Hageman** led all scorers with 18 points. She also added four rebounds and two blocks. Like the Cobbers, SMU also had three players score at least 10 points. **Nichole Hanson** went 5-of-7 from behind the arc and finished with a team-high 15 points. **Jessica Weisbrod** recorded a game-high eight rebounds and added 14 points and **Kelly Tanke** came off the bench to score an even 10 points. Concordia shot 43.9% (25-of-57) from the field and 41.7% (5-of-12) from 3-point range. CC was also 15-of-20 (75.0%) from the free throw line. St. Mary's connected on 40.7% (22-of-54) of their field goal attempts and 35.7% (5-of-14) from outside the arc.

SERIES SYNOPSIS: Concordia has won eight straight against the Cardinals, including the first game of this year's series. CC has also won 23 of the past 24 at home vs. SMU.

Concordia vs. St. Mary's Game 1 Recap

Concordia 66 at St. Mary's 57 – Jan. 20, 2008

The replay of the Concordia/St. Mary's game on Sunday will never be found on ESPN Classics, but in the end the results was just what the Cobbers wanted as they beat the Cardinals 66-57 in Winona. The two teams combined for 43 turnovers and made only one field goal in the first 10 minutes of play in the second half. Despite the choppy play, CC came away with their ninth win the last ten games and improved to 9-5 overall and 8-3 in the MIAC. The 8-3 conference mark at the halfway point of the league season is identical to the record Concordia had after 11 games last season.

St. Mary's loses for the third straight game and the fifth time in the last six games. The Cardinals finish the first half of MIAC play with a 2-9 league mark and are now 3-11 overall.

The decisive run for the Cobbers came at the end of the first half. With the score tied at 23-23 at the 4:54 mark, Concordia went on a 13-2 run to grab an 11-point lead at 36-25. That spurt would lead to a 36-28 cushion at the break and give CC a comfortable safety net for the entire second half.

In the second period, Concordia led by as many as 15 points with just under eight minutes to play but the Cardinals went on a run to cut the lead to six points at 53-47 with 2:41 to play. The Cobbers made nine free throws down the stretch to salt away the nine-point win.

Meet The Head Coach – Mandy Pearson

Mandy Pearson is the head women's basketball coach at Saint Mary's University of Minnesota, a position she has held since the beginning of the 2007-08 season. Along with her coaching duties, Mandy serves as an instructor in the physical education department on campus, teaching various courses. Previously, Pearson spent two years as the assistant women's basketball coach at Hamline University. Also with her coaching duties, she served as the assistant strength and conditioning coach as well as an instructor in the physical education department. While at Hamline, Mandy was a part of the women's basketball programs first ever play-off appearance. Pearson completed her undergraduate degree from Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota, majoring in Psychology, while also earning minors in sociology, health and coaching. During her playing days at Concordia, Pearson was the Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference's Player of the Year during the 2003-04 and 2004-05 seasons.

Heading into the 2007-08 season, the Saint Mary's University women's basketball team would love nothing better than to have a two-time Minnesota Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Player of the Year on its roster. And they do — sort of. Unable to boast the conference's best player, the Cardinals did the next best thing — they hired her as their new head coach.

And Mandy Pearson — a two-time conference player of the year during her playing days at Concordia — can hardly wait to transform her successes on the court as a player to success as the Cardinals' head coach. "I have been involved in the MIAC — playing and coaching (as an assistant coach the past two seasons at Hamline) — for the past six years and am very excited to continue my career in the conference as a head coach," said Pearson. "I am excited to take all the things I have learned as an athlete and coach, and use them to lead this program."

Pearson inherits a squad that went 7-18 a year ago, including a disappointing 11th-place finish in the MIAC with a 5-16 mark. She also inherits an all-conference performer in senior Jess Weisbrod (Rollingstone, Minn.), not to mention the Cardinals' top two scorers from a year ago.

Weisbrod was the team's offensive leader, boasting team-highs of 12.7 points-per-game and 7.3 rebounds-per-game en route to her first-ever all-conference honor, while fellow senior Kelly Tanke (La Crosse, Wis.) enjoyed a career year in 2006-07, averaging 10.2 ppg and 3.3 rpg.

"It's going to be a bit of a learning experience for everyone," Pearson said. "For our upperclassmen, this is their third coach in three seasons, so, again, they are starting out the season learning a new system and a new style of coaching. We're going to rely heavily on the leadership of our upperclassmen," added. "Their leadership is going to be extremely important for our success this season."

Success that Pearson is going to measure by goal-setting and doing "the little things" — and doing them well. "Our team has goals we want to accomplish every game, goals that have nothing to do with what the final score is," said Pearson. "We are focusing on small successes to lead us in the right direction. When you accomplish the little things, winning takes care of itself.

"It's those little things that can make a big difference."
