**LAST TIME THEY MET:** The last time these two teams squared off was back on February 13, 2008 in Bismarck. That match marked the first time in 20 years the two schools had faced each other on the mat. In the dual in Bismarck, Concordia won seven individual matches and came away with a 34-11 victory. In the match, the Cobbers used the strength of three pin falls to come away with the 23-point win. **Joe Leacox**, **Justin Berns** and **Phil Moenkedick** all pinned their opponent, but the most impressive win of the night was turned in by **Tony Neumann** who beat **Dusty Vliem** 6-5 in the 197-lb weight class match. Vliem was named the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC), a Division II league, Wrestler of the Week on Jan. 22 and had posted wins over nationally-ranked opponents on the DII level.

The match started with the Cobbers getting a forfeit at 125. **Alex Vosberg** was handed the win to pick up his sixth win of the year. Leacox then pinned the Marauder's **Cody Schmidt** 4:37 into the match, putting the Cobbers up 12-0. After dropping the next match at 141, Concordia would win the next four matches. At 149, Berns defeated **Shawn Sneva** by pinfall at 5:50. For Berns it was his eighth pin of the year and 29th overall victory. **Logan Lunde** followed that win with a major decision win (14-1) over **Devin Nagel** in the 157-lb match-up. **Lane Lunde** pulled out a 3-1 decision in his 165-pound match. After having his match tied at 1-1 early in the third period, Lunde would follow with a two-point takedown to win 3-1. Moenkedick completed the four straight wins by pinning the Marauder's **Nick Lopez** in :28 seconds for a 31-3 Cobber lead. It was Moenkedick's team-leading 32nd win of the season and team-leading 13th pin of the year.

**Kurt Wiedrich** snapped the Marauders slide with a 10-5 win over **Cody Salo** at 184.

Neumann would then get CC back on the winning track with his big win over Vliem. Neumann recorded a one-point escape in the final period to claim the victory.

Mary would win the heavyweight match-up and bring the final score to 34-11.

### LAST MATCH RECAP

**Concordia 18 at MSU Moorhead 22**  
No.7-ranked Concordia was an upset away from posting another huge dual-meet win. The Cobbers tried to rally from a 9-0 hole to start their match against cross-town rival MSU Moorhead but came up four points short and lost 22-18. The meet started with the match at 285 and then went to the 125-lb weight class dual. MSU Moorhead was able to come away with a pin and a decision in the opening two bouts and grabbed a 9-0 lead. Concordia finally got on the board when **Joe Leacox** earned a 9-5 decision at 133. Leacox won the match on the strength of a pair of first-period takedowns. The swing match of the night came at 141 where No.4-ranked **Ben Anderson** lost for the first time in the past 13 matches. He got stuck at the end of the first period in his match with **Brady Schneeberger**. Schneeberger came up with a reversal and then a 3-point near fall in the final minute of the period to come away with the majority of his points. He was able to slow down the match and hold Anderson off in the final two periods. Trailing 12-3, **Justin Berns** recorded a 6-1 decision at 149. The Dragons then won the dual in the next three matches as they posted a pair of decisions and a major decision. The trio of wins pushed their lead to 22-6.

Concordia then narrowed the final score by posting a pair of pin falls. All-American **Phil Moenkedick** made quick work of his opponent at 184. Moenkedick had an early take down and then got his opponent on his back and came away with a pin fall at 2:43. CC freshman **Nate Schmitz** then added to his ever-growing win total. Schmitz finished off the dual meet by scoring a pin at 3:29. Before the pin, Schmitz had scored three takedowns in the first period. The win was Schmitz' team-leading 27th of the season. He has won 10 of his last 12 matches.

### SENIOR SENDOFF

Tonight's dual meet marks the final time that the five Cobber seniors will take the mat in Memorial Auditorium. **Justin Horne**, **Tanner Jorud**, **Joe Leacox**, **Lane Lunde** and **DJ Ringquist** have all helped the team in their own way and have all been huge contributors to the team's resurgence in the past few years. They have poured their sweat, aches and pains into the wrestling room over the past four years and all will be missed as the team goes forward next season. The entire Concordia athletic department would like to thank all five for their commitment, dedication and hard work. They have brought Cobber wrestling back to the forefront of the college scene. We wish all five the best of luck as they head away from Cobberville and remind them to come back and stay in touch with the program they helped build.

### COBBER NOTES

Tonight's match is the second-to-last dual match of the season for the Cobbers. Concordia is currently 11-5 on the year and needs only one more win to break the school record for dual-match wins in a single season. The 1984-85 Cobber team went 11-4-1 and holds the program record...Concordia has four wrestlers ranked in the top 10 of the nation. Daron Hohbein, Ben Anderson, Justin Berns and Phil Moenkedick are all in the top 10 of the latest Adidas/Brute national poll. That marks the first time in C history the team has had more than three wrestlers in the top 10 of the nation...the Cobbers also have six wrestlers with at least 20 wins on the year. Freshman **Nate Schmitz** leads the team in victories with 27...perhaps the hottest Cobber wrestler right now will not be on the mat tonight. Senior **Justin Horne** is 6-1 in his last seven matches and is coming off a first-place finish at the Dickinson St. Inv. and a runner-up showing at the North Country Inv.

### Nagel, Anderson Claim Wins, but #9 Huskies Sled Past Marauders (2/5/10)

Bismarck, ND - Taylor Nagel and Brady Anderson both picked up wins for the University of Mary but 9th-ranked St. Cloud State University pulled away early on the way to a 32-7 Huskies Northern Sun win over the Marauders.

The Huskies claimed the first five decisions, including one due to an open weight class at 133 and an injury withdrawal at 149, to take a decisive 22-0 lead.

Nagel picked up the Marauders first win of the night at 165, defeating Joe Anderson 7-5. A tight match throughout, the duo entered the third period tied 2-2. Nagel took a 3-2 lead on an escape but fell behind 4-3 on a takedown. Nagel then grabbed a lead with a two-point reversal before Anderson evened the match on an escape. A final takedown gave Nagel the win for the first Marauders points of the night.

After a major decision by SCSU at 174, Anderson picked up a major decision of his own with a 10-1 win over Ted Saatzer. Anderson led 2-0 after one period on a takedown. An escape and a takedown in the second pushed his lead to 5-1 before dominating the final period. Anderson scored another five points on a takedown, a nearfall and riding time.

In the signature match of the night, SCSU's Luke Munkelwitz, ranked sixth in the nation and second in the region, defeated Dusty Vliem 8-3 in the 197-pound match. Vliem entered the match third in the region, just behind Munkelwitz. Vliem jumped out to a 2-0 lead on a takedown. Munkelwitz responded with an escape to end the first and earned escape, stalling and takedown points in the second to lead 5-2. Vliem cut his deficit to 5-3 on an escape to open the third but Munkelwitz scored another takedown and riding time to seal his win.

The Marauders are now 2-8 overall and 0-5 in the Northern Sun in duals. SCSU improves to 11-6 and 3-1.

U-Mary returns to the mat February 10 when the Marauders go on the road to face Concordia College.
